5 student Social Workers spent 1,441 hours on placement in Somerset, Isle of Wight, Portsmouth and Dorset gaining valuable experience for their future careers.

2 Criminology students gave 390 hours to support VOCAS and Be Heard for people experiencing Anti-Social Behaviour Across Bristol, Isle of Wight and Somerset 6 volunteers delivered 327 hours of advocacy to people who have been assessed as lacking capacity.
